Read Matthew 28:16-20

How can we be sure that Jesus' command was to future believers and not just to the eleven disciples present with Him?

What does it say about Jesus' role in our lives when we neglect his command to make disciples?

What are some legitimate hindrances to our task of making disciples? What are some practical ways that we can overcome these? How can we help each other overcome these obstacles?

Verse 17 tells us the disciples doubted even when standing in front of the risen Christ. When you have moments of doubt, what are some go-to verses that strengthen your faith?

Why is verse 18 so important to understand before you get to Jesus' teaching in verses 19 and 20?

In what way does worship fuel evangelism?

How can you tell if Jesus has authority in your life?

The word Go can be translated "as you go." In your life, where is your "as you go?"

Explain the following statement: Whether we are doing it well or doing it poorly, we are discipling in every interaction we have.

How important is baptism to making disciples? Is it optional for believers?

What happens when the church's focus is on making converts, but they neglect to teach all Jesus commanded?

How can someone fulfill the great commission if they are a stay at home parent, home bound senior, or student in school?

Jesus promises to be with us in verse 20. How does he fulfill that promise for Christians today?

How can we use our time as a Bridge group to better equip one another to make disciples?
